# GOLF TIP OF THE MONTH It's All About the Grip

Worn-out club grips can be slick, causing your grip to slip or making you hold on too tightly.

Grips that are too large cause your hands to react too slowly to your swing. Grips that are too small cause your hands to overreact. Either way, your shot won't go straight.

The only thing between you and your golf club besides the grip is your glove. While some golfers do fine without one, having a good golf glove on hand is another way to reduce slippage and increase consistency in your shots. Most gloves are made of leather and are worn on the hand opposite the one that is dominant.



# TENNIS TIP: PLACEMENT OVER POWER


The two most popular "P" words in tennis and actually many other sports are placement and power. Which one is better?

Which one should you use?
And when? Well if you get both in one shot, you're off to the races. But let's face it most of us reading this are 5.0 players or lower including myself. So even though you have

that desire to hit every ball with rock solid power, it's just not the right choice. Placement then power leads to more consistent tennis. The touring pro's that you see on TV, might be able to do it for a certain "streaky" portion of their match. But they are also practicing 3-6 hours a day! In our world of tennis we should air on the side of placement 1st, and power 2nd. A good time to maybe give your shot a little extra "bang" is when your up heavily and confident in a set or match. Another good time for more "pop" on your ball is when you get that short high ball. Careful though, the ball is short so there's less court to hit into. There's so many more examples I can give you on this topic, but for that, you'll have to come see me on the courts!
