

TENNIS TIP: KEEP YOUR RACKET HEAD UP ON VOLLEYS!

Too many times when I watch club players at the net, I see them with their racket heads dangling below their waists. From that starting position you are going to have to: lift, turn and punch your volleys. That's a 3 step process. You can easily turn this action into a 2 step (quicker) process by starting with your racket head already up. So when you find yourself in a volleying position at the net. Get your hands up with your racket head well above your wrists, similar to a boxer who is protecting his face with his gloves. From this position you eliminate the "lift" step and only have to "turn & punch" at the ball. That fraction of a second that you shave off your

reaction time will help your accuracy and ability to hit good volleys.

The biggest difference between a groundstroke and a volley is that on the groundies you start with your racket head below your wrist. On the volleys we need that racket head to be securely above the wrist. If you follow these steps you'll be on your way to cool, clean, crisp volleys that shock your opponents. See you soon and good luck on the courts!
